On 28th November 2020, I went to mountain Pinnacles, 759 metres above sea-level.

I were looking for young short Northern ratas in Kauaeranga Valley and Coromandel Forest Park, for me to photograph the flowers, but all of Northern ratas were too tall for me to climb to photograph the red flowers.

In Coromandel Forest Park at 1:28pm, I saw the Forest ringlet butterfly (dodonidia helmsii) and photographed the butterfly. Then I carried on walking to mountain Pinnacles, I were less tired than last time I went to Pinnacles on 31st July 2020, with I walked faster, than people, and much better weather than July.

When I was on summit, I can see Tairua town on eastern coast, and surroundings. *Clinton Care*
